### Commissioner's Message

I released the Police Commissioner's intent for the 2023 in December last year. In my intent I declared 2023 as the "Year of Law and Order", consistent with the intentions of the Government. There are three key areas of focus for the Royal Papua New Guinea Constabulary for 2023 and going forward and these are:

- **Growing and improving the RPNGC;**
- **Building a safer Papua New Guinea;**
- **Strengthening Partnership, Government and Accountability; and**
- **Infrastructure Development.**

My intent is to provide every Papua New Guinean visible indicators that policing services are being delivered. Disciplined Police personnel, that are well-presented and organised, using modern technology provide greater efficiencies, have

increased accountability, and most importantly improve police responses.

National Police HQ will drive accountability and integrity from the top down to every police officer. This includes Police Headquarters and Police Stations across PNG holding a monthly parade where the Commander will assess presentation, attendance and reminds frontline Police of their responsibilities. The Corporate Plan 2021 – 2023 is road map that the Constabulary drives its development agendas. Other intervention Police strategies such as PREP – Police Reform Enhancement Program through Special Police Assistance Program that is adding more value to the force advancement.

The RPNGC is working with strategic partners to

stand-up emergency help lines and general inquiry lines in every Provincial Command. A Strategic Partnership Engagement Unit has been established at the Police Headquarters to enhance and strengthen the collaboration bilateral partners and line agencies.

The National Police Headquarters will monitor the frequency of calls and continue to enhance responses with local Police Commanders.

Overall, public accountability will be every Police Commander's top priority as compliance will be monitored and performance managed. Below are the Provincial and District Police Development Plan for public information and for a holistic approach in delivering a robust and community-oriented police service through partnership.
